












The Jubilee Challenge is part of the Ten Tors event run by the Army.

We took a team of 4 pupils up to Okehampton on the Friday afternoon to set up camp and prepare for our almost 8 mile walk.










The Ten Tors Campsite—We are there somewhere amongst the 2500 other teenagers!!

The team keen and ready to go!!
















