# Upper School News




## Lamorna Class


# Curriculum focus— Art & Design

This month's focus is Art and Design, part of our creative curriculum. Within the curriculum we explore three key areas, 3d construction/collage/drawing & mark making. Within each area focusing upon the key skills of Producing exploring & recording/evaluation & analysis and progressing within our technical proficiency through the use of a wide range of tools, medias and materials. We encourage our children to use Art to express themselves, include their own ideas to make their own creative Art.

In Curnow we study a wide range of artists, craft makers and designers, studying their work and linking it to our own, we also often have local artists to share their work.

Last year we went to Paignton caught the steam train to Kingsclere and then went on the ferry to Dartmouth where we enjoyed chips by the harbour.

We then stayed at a 2 bedroom chalet in Seaton. The next day we caught a tram from Seaton to Colyton. The stairs up aren't very wide but we managed to get up them. The tram is open top and we went across the marshlands seeing the birds and cows. Very sensory as we had the breeze blowing on us, the motion and sounds. Not a lot to do at Colyton so I would recommend driving to Colyton and catch the tram to Seaton where you can then play on the beach. There is seating down stairs on the tram. It's not wheelchair accessible but we managed it and stored his buggy downstairs.

We had no trouble accessing toilets.
